



events Some good news for the Parish, at November's Parish Council meeting it was agreed to add a new item to the agenda, an item to consider Commufor the latest local news and nity Wellbeing. My argument was that, as a Parish Council, this is one thing that we have a duty and responsibility to consider, and everyone agreed. I have already been in touch with some peers, who serve the community in one way or another, to discuss what and how we might, as a Parish Council, address this very important concern. Everyone seems to have a good idea and, like me, wonders why it has never been an item on the agenda before, but. I think we are the first Council to think of it. Cowes Town Council are also considering having Community Wellbeing as an agenda item, and want me to structure something up for them to enable this to happen, which great. If we can make this meaningful and useful, it the village website: www.northwoodvillage.org.uk would be great to see all Town and Parish Councils follow our example. If all it does is raise awareness to an official level, then that will be a good thina.

The Friends of Northwood Cemetery have been successful in securing Lottery funding to help maintain and develop the cemetery, its grounds and buildings. The plans include developing a heritage and conservation trail and resource centre, opening up to provide learning experiences for schools and visitors and to create a woodland burial ground. All this has been achieved by the hard work and support from the Friends and Stakeholder Advisory Group, and, although I have only become involved recently, they seem a pretty resourceful group with sound ideas and knowledge of how to bring them into being. As stated, there are other good examples of how organisations have brought formerly remote facilities more into the community as valuable multi-resources and destinations. Quarr Abbey and Carisbrooke Priory are only two examples of what can be done; a cemetery is not just for burying people.

Many people want to know what is happening about the Post Office. 14 **COWES FLOATING BRIDGE**

Discussion took place on the letter and attachments received from the IW Council, seeking views on the possible introduction of charges for the use of the floating bridge by pedestrians and cyclists. Councillors highlighted that when fares were tried previously it had proved to be unworkable and cost more than the revenue raised. The present system made a net contribution to the budget. Any changes would require additional staffing costs, which could then prove to be unviable. Reference was made to the joint bid for funding from the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership and that the design of the new bridge could secure a reduction in running costs that might well be sufficient to cover any additional associated costs. It was decided that the reasons provided by the IW Council were not considered to be sufficient to support the implementation of charges for the use of the floating bridge by pedestrians and cyclists. A better case had been made out to oppose any proposed charge. However, the objectives for a new bridge, as set out, were welcomed. **NEWS FROM THE CLERK** It had been reported that for whatever reason, some local children had cut all the ties to the new goal nets at Veneer Avenue and pulled them out of the clips. The newly seeded grass had taken well, but it was still too early to remove the fencing. With regard to setting up alternative goalpost locations, suitable sockets had still to be sourced to enable any further progress.
