

From Rev Diana....

"Honour vour father and mother" - This is the fifth Commandment that ends with the promise, "You will have a long life, full of blessings." And a specific word to fathers from Ephesians Chapter 6 - "Don't make your children anary by the way you treat them, bring them up with the discipline and instruction approved by the Lord."

A little girl asked her mum, "Mummy, how did we get to be here, us humans and the world?" Her mum explained by telling her about God, how he made the world, the sun and moon, animals, and finally making Adam and Eve. Amazed by this the girl went away. Not sure how much of it was true she found her Dad and asked him the same auestion. "We come from monkeys!" he replied. Startled, the child returned to her mum and said, "I asked Daddy where we came from and HE said we come from MONKEYS!" "Ah well!" said her mum. "the story I told you was all about MY side of the family!"

June is the month we celebrate Father's Day here in the UK and this year it is 21st June. It's the day when we celebrate and thank our dads for all they do for us. Unlike Mother's Day or Mothering Sunday with its traditional and historic link with the church, Father's Day came to the UK much later, with its origins set in US history. In 1909, whilst listening to a Mothering Sunday sermon, a young woman called Sonora Smart Dodd felt inspired to talk to her Pastor about creating a celebration of the same sort for fathers. Mothers were getting all the love and credit, but fathers deserved something too....Sonora's own Father, a Civil War Veteran, had brought up his six children alone after his wife died in childbirth. So inspired by the way her father had created for them such a strong and loving environment, she decided that there should be a special day on which fathers all over the country could be celebrated, just as mothers were. Sonora's wish was granted and eventually the third Sunday of June was chosen.

However, there are some who believe that the tradition can be traced back to the ruins of Babylon and a boy named Elmesu who carved the first ever Father's Day message into clay nearly 4000 years ago. Elmesu wished his father good health and a long life, and is thought to be the first recorded instance of a Father's Day card.

'Father' is an important concept for the church, as many of us know and love God as our heavenly Father. He is the Figurehead of the church, the Protector. Guide, and Comforter, But He is much more. Through His son Jesus Christ. He is our Saviour, Brother, and Friend. What's more we are made in His Image. So yes, Father's Day should certainly be celebrated in a big way as we give thanks to our earthly fathers for all they are to us and all their support as well as again remembering God our Heavenly Father for all He does for us, in and through Jesus Christ our Lord.





days. That may be good news for us, but it does reflect quite a shift in the environment. I wonder if that is good or bad for us, certainly a bit of warmer weather for a bit longer stretch in the year does not go a miss. but I think there is an underlying warning (a black lining in the silver cloud, if you like) that we need to be conscious and take better care of our environment. There are things that national government can do: rules and regulation, and there are steps that local Councils can take as well, but there are things that we can all do and think about that can make a difference. And, the question is: what to do you care about enough to do something to make a difference? It is a topical question, in a growing topical movement and debate that not only covers our natural environment, but our created environment too. It covers or built environment, our health, our mental wellbeing and happiness, our learning and employment, and levels of crime. After years of taking power and responsibility away from people and replacing it with mindless and costly processes, we find that, in some ways, we are an unhealthier society, with illnesses that are inflicted through poor diet, lack of exercise, lack of care and forethought in occupational health, mental disorders through the stress, worries and neurosis incurred in a less personal society and crimes that may be committed by being driven through mental health or psychological issues created by our modern living, desperate circumstances or, even, pedantic focus on the regulatory process rather than on people (how many people do you know that have been prosecuted just for not displaying a parking permit, not following a process properly, or some other pedantry, when there is no obstruction or real offence or problem other than that created by the process itself?).



now being recognised, for example, in health, where, as a society, whenever we get something wrong with ourselves, we just go to the doctor and get some medicine to deal with the symptoms, so that we can carry on doing whatever it is in our lifestyle that is causing the problem in the first place. This doesn't only apply to health, but to all of what I was talking about above, to greater and lesser degrees. Now the surgeries and the hospitals are struggling to cope, governmental centralisation is defunct. I don't know what to say about mental health and education situation, and we have become a less caring society. But all is not lost, as I say, there is a drive and recognition for localisation, for community wellbeing and involvement, for joined up resources and thinking, and a recognition for the need of refocus and rationalisation from the Police and Health Service (note the recent highlighting of over prescription of anti-biotics, and, now, over prescribing in general). This is where Town and Parish Councils really come into play, as focal points and conduits in a new fractal restructuring of our society, where the constant question arises: do vou care enough about something to do something about it yourself, to help yourself and for all of us to help each other? Whether that is talking, doing, giving or receiving or facilitating; we all have something to give and we all have a need of some sort. It is putting humanity back in humans, and making human structures with a heart. rather than mechanical. And, I am proud to say that Northwood is at the lead in this new thinking, where the Parish is a pilot in this new direction.



MAY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the Annual meeting, Chris Riddet was elected Chairman and David Jaggar, Vice- Chairman and Chairman of the Planning committee.

POLICE REPORT

Derek Howard, of the Cowes NPT was present and referred to his report, which had been circulated prior to the meeting. Particular mention was made of the following:

An update of the team. Unfortunately PCSO Dawn Clarke would shortly be leaving Annual crime statistics. Crimes over the past year had increased by 31% on the previous year. Although in reality this was an increase of only18 crimes, indicating that Northwood continued to be a very safe place to live

Community priorities continued to be cyclists and cars using the High Street in Cowes, during times of prohibition. Two further priorities had been created, these being to target the rising reports of shop lifting in the Terminus Road area and criminal damage to motor vehicles along Arctic Road.

Establishing an effective method to determine community priorities, by way of an online survey. Starting up Police and Community Together (PACT) meetings.

Mention was made of motor cyclists careering around the bluebell woods, near to Medham cycle track. PCSO Howard advised to report any incidents on 101, immediately so that the police stood a chance of catching the culprits.

The complaint made by a resident of Nodes Road with regard to perceived speeding in the area would be passed on to the road and traffic team.

COMMUNITY WELLBEING

The Chairman welcomed Anita Cameron-Smith, Director of Public Health and Community Well-Being, along with Jacqui Spalding and Brian Hurley to the meeting. Discussion ensued on the outcomes of the recent ABCD (Asset Based Community Development) seminars and councillors confirmed their interest in being involved in the scheme. Training and support would be provided by Nurture Development

Councillors proposed for Cllr J Nicholson to take the lead, along with Cllr Pullen suggesting that they meet to discuss the way forward and then prepare a report, in time for the June meeting.
