

The comments made in the following articles represent the views of the individual contributors, rather than Northwood Parish Council.

Presentation

The Chairman welcomed Peter Griffiths, Principal Planning Officer -Housing at the IW Council, who gave a presentation referring to the Island Plan Core Strategy and some of the associated documents. Councillors confirmed that they considered the production of a Neighbourhood Plan untenable due to the workload and particularly the





costs involved. The most feasible option would be for the Parish Council to work with the IW Council in the development of the Area Action Plan for the Medina Valley. To this end the Parish Council proposed to update and augment the Parish Plan, to include the results of a reliable Housing Needs survey that would provide an accurate picture of actual housing need.

Mr Griffiths mentioned the Guidance document produced for communities to undertake Housing Needs surveys. Although unable to provide a guesstimate of the costs involved. Mr Griffiths suggested that contact be made with Wootton Bridge Parish Council who was further down this route.

The next step for IW Council officers would be, in April, to map all the sites put forward for potential housing allocations. In May, subject to the consent of the landowners, a site visit would then be undertaken. It was suggested that the involvement of the Parish Council in this stage would be useful. Mr Griffiths would liaise with Cllr Bentley, as lead councillor of the Parish Plan Working Party, during the next few weeks.

them Discussion ensued on the planters and tubs around the village. The saw Northwood in Bloom Working Party had still to undertake a complete review of their condition. However, should any require replacement it was suggested that the two planters at the top of Coronation Avenue could be that moved from their position. Alternatively, these could be moved to sites near to entrances to the village, at the lower end of Pallance Road or advertisers Noke Common. A suggestion was also made as to possible summer bulb planting along the grass verges in these areas, similar to that found in other parishes across the island. This would require prior approval of the IW Council.

our Quotations had been obtained to water all the planters/tubs on a similar tell basis as the previous year. The clerk reminded that the application for up to £750 matched funding for the costs of planting and the watering Please thereof had been successful. The need to replace the soil in the planters had been raised at a previous meeting. It was now an opportune time to investigate the costings for so doing.

Queen's Diamond Jubilee

The agreed to provide a mug as a memento for all the 225 children who attend Northwood Primary school, to include the name of the Parish Council within the design and of a similar quality to those being provided by Gurnard Parish Council and Cowes Town Council.

Transport and Traffic

Reference was made to the Minutes of the meeting of the Cowes. Northwood and Gurnard Community Transport forum held on 14 March. 320 timetables had been printed and displayed in 12 timetable holders at

key locations. Thanks and appreciation were expressed to Mr Charlie Barnard for his work in this regard, and at no charge.

Councillors rode on the bus on the first day of the new timetable to ensure all went well and reported no problems. The timetable now allowed for the drivers to have a short comfort break at the Co-op, in Cowes.

The clerk reported difficulties in receiving the monies collected on the Route 32. No money had been passed over for 6 weeks.

Attention was drawn to the number of road closures and roadworks taking place in the Cowes wider area, which affected the bus reliability. It was suggested that Mr Peter Hayward of the IW Council be invited to a future meeting so that councillors concerns could be raised, an invitation has been sent for him to attend the June meeting.

Safer Neighbourhood Report

Bottles of milk have been taken from residences in Oxford Street. This seems to happen every now and again.

A bike was stolen from a garden.

There has been an incidence of graffiti in a bus shelter in Nodes Road. This being similar to an incident that occurred in Gurnard and formed part of an on-going investigation being undertaken by PC Pringle.

In connection with the graffiti issue, compensation could form part of any sentence of the guilty persons, providing those affected submitted details of any costs incurred for the removal of the graffiti. The same 'tag' had occurred in the current spate of damage. The police had a description of the person they would be interested in speaking to.

Within the Parish of Northwood a couple of commercial burglaries had taken place. A person had been arrested and charged.

What Northwood church means to me

The ancient village churches of England are a precious part of our nation's heritage. Our church of St John the Baptist began in the late twelfth century - the age of Robin Hood of Sherwood Forest. In those days the north of the Island too was covered by forest after which church and village are named with more deer, wild boar and wolves than human beings. After his conquest of England, King William gave the Island to his childhood friend, William FitzOsbern. A typical Norman, William combined warfare with concern for his soul. He in turn gave several parishes including Carisbrooke to his favourite abbey of Lyre back in Normandy.

Lyre set up a Priory at Carisbrooke to administer their booty. The Priory set up four chapels, one of which was our first church. It was probably a simple stone box with a door at one end, altar at the other, earthen floor and thatched roof. Why John the Baptist? He preached in the wilderness ; his rough dress and manners would make him the ideal patron for a church in the wild woods. Its purpose was less spiritual than mercenary. Northwood acted as a collection point for tithes (10% of produce church tax) shipped along the Medina to the Priory or away to Lyre. Tithe-payers would swear a solemn oath in church that they hadn't dodged their tax.

Over the centuries the church survived wars, famine and plaque. In the 14th century the medieval village surrounding it died out hence its distance from today's Northwood. It was "one of the ruins Cromwell knocked about a bit". Unlike St Mary's, Whippingham and Newport it escaped the Victorians' zeal for rebuilding churches. Through its ups and downs it has continued at the heart of the community marking the great seasons of the year - Christmas, Easter, Harvest and the rites of passage - baptism, weddings, funerals.

Over the years buildings and worship have changed but as we pass beneath the chevroned archway - perhaps that of the original tiny chapel in the woods - we walk in the footsteps of past generations of Englishmen and women who came here to worship their God. Let us hope we can hand it on to future generations sound in fabric and vibrant in spirit.

REPORT - MAY 2012 Energy Saving in Island Schools

The Isle of Wight Council is working in partnership with the Isle of Wight Schools' Forum to help reduce the amount of energy used in schools. Currently schools account for 43 per cent of the council's total carbon footprint, which costs the council around £100,000 per year in carbon taxes, which were introduced by the Government as part of its Carbon Reduction Commitment scheme.

As part of the work to make schools more energy efficient, the council has recruited an energy and carbon management officer on a two-vear fixed term post funded by the Isle of Wight Schools' Forum.

Mason Murray, who has a background in facilities management, will work with schools to help them identify ways of saving energy – which will both save money and help contribute towards the council's target of reducing its carbon footprint by six per cent each year. Part of his work will be to monitor data from smart meters that the council has installed at every Island school. These provide detailed information about gas and electricity usage, making it easier to identify potential savings. For my part I am pleased the council has set tough targets to reduce its carbon footprint. This appointment shows our commitment to achieving these reductions which will not only be better for the environment but will save the schools and the council money.

Changes to Width Restrictions in Pallance Road

Draft proposals have been published by Highways to correct an historical error in the extent of the present Pallance Road width restriction limiting the size of large commercial vehicles using Pallance Road via Hillis Corner and Rolls Hill as a short cut through to Thorness and Yarmouth etc. The original order incorrectly missed out the Hillis Gate Road section, so this Order will rectify this omission and correctly designate the roads covered by the restriction which the police have now stated must be done to legally limit the amount of large commercial traffic using these roads.
