Another of my long standing campaigns that is just starting to bare awareness is to raise recognition and awareness instigate action in addressing the wide issues around mental state. It was because of my work and understanding in this regard that I am universally nominated as champion Mental Health for the Council. It is essential that this work has continuity, especially when the, yet fragile, fruits of this labour are just starting to show. It was nearly two years ago that I introduced members of the Council, Police and Education to Professor Steve Peter's Chimp Management programme (a performance tool that addresses mental state issues across a wide platform of situations – schools, crime, health and personal performance - and which has been credited in our recent Olympic sports success phenomenon), and right now the CCG are considering the programme in their work. Many will understand just how important this work is from its burgeoning note in the media and from my reports and work, locally.

I have also been stating for years, how important business is to the local community, and that it is through supporting and developing local industry and employment that the Island will grow and prosper. In this regard, I was the only Councillor to join the local Technology Group and have supported and promoted events that have served to raise the profile of the little know and incredible business resource that we have on the Island. This too, thankfully, is now being widely recognised, and there are many more voices in the community (who understand far more than I do) stating the same message, so, now this has become a self-perpetuating mantra for the Island, now, quite independent of my lone voice, as years ago.

It is not just in Council that I am active on community matters, I am the long-standing chairman of CAMRA, have brought Cowes to be a major venue in the annual Beer and Vintage Buses festival, also, co-developing an acclaimed Historic Walk through Cowes, that maps its social history in its rise to become a significant sea port, and, I am currently engaged in co-developing a Cowes Blitz Walk for the 75th Anniversary Commemoration of the Blyskawica, the Polish battleship that saved Cowes during WWII.

Election Letter

I am hoping that you will return me as your representative Councillor for the next 4-year term, regardless of what your politics are. I hope and feel that I have served you and the community well. I am com-

mitted to building community strengths, as those who know me and have read my newsletters will know, and this is reflected in the positions that I have taken, as a Councillor, and, also, in my business life and my social life.

As a County Councillor, the first thing I did was to commit myself to the local Town and Parish Councils, who, also, represent the local community In Cowes. where I was involved in the reformation of the Council to a more efficient and business-like structure, I accepted chairmanship of the dynamic Projects Committee. In Northwood, I became vice chairman of the long-standing Community Partnership and introduced Community Wellbeing as an agenda item at the Parish Council (the first, I believe, to do so on the Island). That commitment will continue to build, as my applications for Town and Parish have already been successful, but, for County (Cowes South and Northwood), I still need your vote! At County level, it was me that proposed the motion for recognition and inclusion of Complimentary Medicine in Health and Wellbeing, not least because so many people use these services to good effect. This lead to me facilitating high level dialogue with the CNHC (Council for Natural Health Care – a body set up by the government, and supported by the Prince of Wales, to do just what I was proposing). And, just this year my motion to adopt Policy for regulating scaffolding on the Public Highway (as exampled by Hampshire County Council), so as to ensure public safety is properly addressed and standards properly maintained, was accepted without debate, as was another motion to adopt better controls on the work of the Utility Companies on our Highways, to regulate the duration and quality of works, again, as exampled by other Authorities.

My focus and interest in our Island community, and the way it functions, led me to serve on the Planning Committee, the Children's Committee, the Health and Adult Social Care Scrutiny Committee, and the Environment & Transport Committee. Importantly, leading up to the current special measures crisis in the NHS Trust, I have led a campaign criticising the quality and timeliness of the information that has been presented at health and care committees, and the lack of joined up thinking that fails to connect with the wider community, also, expressed concern on the reports of bullying at the Hospital. This whole system needs to be tightened up, and that is a work in progress for me, for which I need to be returned as an elected member.

NOTES FROM THE APRIL MEETING OF NORTHWOOD P.C.

Public Forum

There was one member of the public in attendance who referred to the matter of alleged speeding along Nodes Road, particularly in the vicinity of the junction at Four Cross, Northwood. The clerk was requested to write to Hampshire Police suggesting for a meeting to take place, on site, between all the relevant parties

To consider the appointment of a contractor for pruning and ongoing maintenance of the six gardens in Northwood

The clerk advised of the problems in obtaining three quotations for undertaking the necessary work. Mr T Hewitt had provided an excellent service during 2016, going beyond the specification outlined. His quotation had also not increased. It was decided Mr T Hewitt of Follow Your Dreams2016 be appointed to prune and provide ongoing maintenance of the six gardens in Northwood, at a total cost of £360.

To consider the purchase of Adobe Acrobat Pro

The cost to purchase Adobe Acrobat Pro was £285 for the Standard version and £445 for the Pro version. Cllr J Nicholson volunteered to investigate whether there were any other applications/software available, which could prove just as suitable for the Parish Council's needs.

To note the latest proposals regarding the Post Office service in Cowes

Councillors noted the letter from Mr N Ennis, Network Transformation Programme Director to Miss S Calver, the Postmistress at the Pallance Road Post Office. This confirmed her existing contract until 30 September 2017. It was reported the Andrew Turner MP continued to press for a suitable resolution on the relocation of the Post Office service in Cowes. However, there was no further update on the matter to report. It was advised that Cowes Town Council were to consider making inquiries into possible, suitable venues for further ATM machines in the town, due to the closures of HSBC and Lloyds Bank, since the beginning of the year.
