



Cowes Highways Update

Following the two separate accidents in Cowes, both at the junction of Victoria Road with Mill Hill Road, Councillors contacted Isle of Wight Council to request that a road warning sign be installed. As the accidents had been attributed to driver error, the council advised that the spending of public money on changes to the junction could not be justified. Cllr Pullen, as the chairman of the Cowes Local Action Group (LAG), volunteered to take this matter forward as one of the priorities for the

Reference was also made to the closure of the Newport Road, from the junction with Three Gates Road to Mill Hill Road, which had resulted in an increase in traffic being diverted along the Victoria Road/Mill Hill Road route. The lack of notice of the twelve week expected closure had also caused serious problems for the No 32 community bus. This had been partially resolved by re-routing the service. The bus now served Seaview Road/Bellevue Road, and had been well received by residents in that area.

Seats for the Cycle Track?

Cllr Fuller has been in contact with the Senior Rights of Way officer at the council regarding seating along the cycle track. It had been confirmed that the IW Council were the landowners along the cycle track. Waste Services were responsible for the maintenance of the area, using large equipment to cut back the undergrowth and grass areas. The Isle of Wight Council highlighted that any obstruction along the cycle track could cause a hindrance, having a detrimental effect on this procedure. It could also potentially lead to a build-up of rubbish and dog excrement in the vicinity of the proposed seating. Cllr Fuller was awaiting a response from Waste Services regarding the viability of installing seating along the track, prior to making any investigations into costs and available funding streams.

ਰੋ streams. Treet Games Initiative

Cllr Ferris advised of her positive discussions with the IW Cricket Development Manager and Northwood Cricket Club. They had agreed to offer fun cricket training to the four local Primary schools, once a week, after school, commencing after the October half term. Funding had also been obtained from 'Chance to Shine', to be used as prizes and additional equipment.

However, the preferred venue, the Cowes Muga, was conditioned against 'private' use. Although, it was believed that a precedent had been set in the past, a formal request has to be submitted to the Northwood Recreation Committee and if approved, would then need to be endorsed by Cowes Town Council. Due to the timescale of meetings this could take until 19th November before any final decision had been taken.

Working Party Updates

Traffic & Transport Issue: Cllr Pullen advised of the new buses now provided by Southern Vectis. The number of volunteer drivers was becoming an issue. A resident in Gurnard had expressed an interest and this needed to be followed up. Cllr Riddet had taken a strong stance in

the successful re-routing of the 32 bus along Seaview Road.

Northwood in Bloom: Volunteers were required towards the end of the month, so to remove the existing summer bedding in readiness for the winter planting. A number of councillors agreed to assist, subject to their availability.

Parish Plan Update: Councillors had been circulated with an updated copy of the proposed Parish Plan Survey and accompanying letter. The Survey, once agreed could be produced within a two week timescale. Councillors discussed how best to circulate the Survey to all the properties in Northwood. It was agreed that to ensure a high return the best option would be to deliver and collect the form by hand. Volunteers would be required to assist with the delivery, more details of this will be in the next edition of Northwood News.

Safer Neighbourhood Report for Northwood

There was an attempted break-in at the garage in Newport Road.

A brand new bike was stolen from outside the Travellers Joy Pub.

This bike was securely padlocked and the thieves used bolt croppers to remove the lock.

The unusual theft of bulbs from the indicator lights off a car parked in Greenways.

It would appear that items are being stolen to order. Thefts of tools from vans are on the increase across the Island, there have been incidents in East Cowes.

There have been reported incidents of a mini motor being driven in Cranleigh Gardens.

On a positive note, no incidents of anti-social behaviour had been reported.

Any areas where the surfacing has stripped off or where the surface quality has been significantly compromised will be marked up for a deeper repair which will be undertaken shortly after the retexturing process.

A series of Frequently Asked Questions has been provided to the contact centre on 01983 821000 to help with public inquiries during the completion of this work. Background: The surface dressing programme was completed in April 2012 with the exception of 3 sites where work was postponed by wet weather. In May and July 2012 in two periods of hot weather, the material used to bind the dressing became unstable. This problem was intensified on roads with high traffic flows and heavy vehicles where the movement of vehicles over the sticky surface stripped patches of the dressing leaving a shallow pothole effect affecting ride qualitv.

NEWS **NORTHWOOD** *Remediation programme:* The sites will be remediated using a hydro blasting technique which uses high pressure water to remove the binder from the road surface thereby exposing the stone and restoring the skidding resistance. The commencement date for this re-texturing programme is being finalised but will begin in October with specific details posted on the weekly road works list and council website. The process is clean and fast causing minimal disruption to ⊆. road users and residents. An example of hydro blasting in action can be viewed at this web site although this may not be the exact piece of equipment used them http://wj-hydroblast.com/highways road marking removal.php. In addition areas with poor ride quality or potholes caused by the surface ≥ dressing having been stripped off will be addressed with a concurrent planning Sa

and patching programme.

you The remediation work is being funded entirely by the surface dressing that contractor, Kiely Brothers Ltd. Highways officers continue to work closely with them to prioritise the roads for treatment and ensure the network operates as advertisers well as possible while this work is completed although the process is a mobile one and not particularly disruptive. Roads will not need to be closed whilst this work is undertaken. Once the binder has been removed we will be able to see if there has been any underlying damage to the road surface and determine if any our further work is required although that is not my expectation. The initial eight sites should be re-textured within a month tell

The effectiveness of the process will be reviewed during that period and further sections scheduled for treatment should that be found necessary.

Please I hope to report next month that our main road has been successfully restored.

Southern Water new Main Sewer Replacement

The rising main sewer which crosses the River Medina by the floating bridge is due for renewal in November with preparatory work commencing in late October with a completion date in March 2013. Whilst the floating bridge will continue in operation, there may be a little inconvenience by the slipway on the Cowes side due to the necessary engineering works.

Sewer Renewal A3020 Somerton to Medical Centre
